The Breakfast Club runs every Tuesday from 7.45 to 8.20am in Block 2.

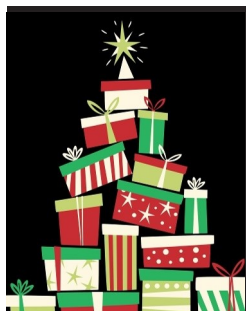
Breakfast club can not be supplied to students after 8.20am as this time is needed for clean up.
